PACKING LIST -- GIRLS You may bring one carry on bag that must fit under a seat or in an overhead compartment, not to exceed 22x14x9). The charge is \$25 for one checked bag not to exceed 50 lbs. or combined length, width and height of 62. Due to Homeland Security, all liquids and creams that you carry on need to be put in one quart-sized zip lock bag. Bottles larger than 3 ounces are not permitted with carry on. This includes contact solution. When packing, think light, loose, and cool!
